Living a life of faith is not easy. Even the prophet Habakkuk knows that. In fact, he has an entire book on the subject. Today's First Reading is sometimes called Habakkuk's complaint. In researching this reading, I found this quote in an essay by the Rev. Dr. Karl Jacobson, author, preacher, and Lutheran pastor: "And this is the life of faith, is it not? To live in between complaint and struggle on the one hand, and God's right time on the other" (*Working Preacher*, © Oct. 6, 2013).

The First Reading and Responsorial Psalm fit hand in glove with the concept of lament. Habakkuk puts the complaint out there before the LORD, and the psalmist resolves the lament in faith: "Let us sing joyfully to the LORD; let us acclaim the Rock of our salvation!" When we sing about a perfect world, we are singing a statement of faith in God, which has not yet come to completion. It will happen in God's good time. Stephen Dean's octavo, "In God's Good Time" [OCP 11082], for SAB, descant, and guitar, would be most appropriate for today and throughout the liturgical year.

Carey Landry beginning on page 12 offers us a change of pace in living a life of faith by showing us how to apply the *lectio divina* to our work in music ministry by praying with the songs we sing. In fact, he provides a methodology on how to do this, and there is *no assembly required*. We pray the texts in silence. He provides seven steps.
